

Travel information from Schiphol Airport to The Hague

If you're travelling from Schiphol to The Hague, you could easily take the train. The railway station is located directly below the airport. It only takes a couple of minutes to walk from Arrivals to Schiphol Plaza, where you can take the escalator down to the platforms. Follow the signs "Trains".

Direct trains to The Hague Central Station (Den Haag CS) will depart from platform 5-6. Click on [this link](#) to find the time table for 30-08-2018

Arriving on Den Haag CS, walk from the platform to the main hall and turn to the left. It will be less than 10 minutes' walk to Holiday Inn and to KIVI, 20 minutes to Carlton Ambassador (see [map](#))

Tickets

You could already buy a train ticket online: <https://www.ns.nl/producten/en/meest-gekocht/p/enkele-reis>. Don't forget to print the ticket! It's also possible to buy a disposable ticket from one of the machines at Schiphol Plaza. Note that you have to check in (at Schiphol Plaza before taking the escalator) and out with the disposable card otherwise it becomes invalid.

In addition to paper tickets, many Dutch people use a public transport card called the 'OV-chipkaart'. This card gives you access to different kinds of public transport, but for the FEANI Central group program, it's not necessary to buy such a card.
